Check this out when you are next in Morgan.

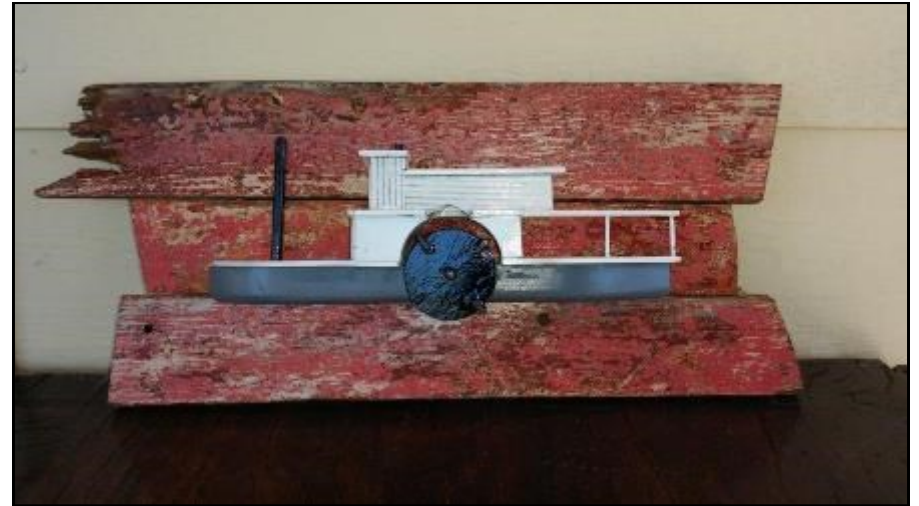
Chairman 's Report

Since our last newsletter much has been done with our project moving forward and the following items covered,

- A very successful 'Morgan Living River' event was carried out. More people than last year. The attendance of the PS Oscar W and a booked out dinner at Landseer's were highlights.
- A Working Bee was carried out where the last of the NZ Kauri was prepared for use and the installation of light pole footings above the Canally mooring so that we can install a floodlight and overhead power to the boat
- Work is continuing with the stripping of the engine from the boiler so that it can be transported to the engineering works at Mount Compass for refurbishment.
- The majority of the hull is dry inside with a small leak in the aft peak which is causing no concern at the moment.
- Oakum and bolts have been purchased.
- Timber from NSW has been sourced. It has arrived in Morgan and been given the tick of approval by the shipwright.
- Power tools for the timberwork have been purchased.
- Mid Murray Council have approved our budget for 2015/2016.
- Concreting of the floor in the Canally shed has been approved with the cost being split between the Museum and Canally. The job is expected to be done in the second half of August.
- The Canally information sign has been installed by Mid Murray Council above the boat.
- 4 knot advisory signs have been received but are yet to be installed.
- The battery charger for the DC pumps failed and has been replaced under warranty.
- One of the DC pumps appears faulty and is being sent back for warranty checks.
- Adam Fitton, shipwright visited the boat recently and has furnished us with a report re future work which is now under consideration by the committee.
- Updated Vessel Management Plan has been sent to Mid Murray Council.
- The new surveillance camera on the wharf has become a useful asset for keeping an eye on the Canally. Once the council are happy with it we will be able to publish the URL so all can see.
- We are still waiting for work to be completed on the Station Master's House so that we can move into our section.
- Replacement floodlight (original stolen from wharf) has been purchased and light pole prepared to attach it along with overhead power cable to the boat.
- Steel tube for steaming timber planking has been purchased and is on site awaiting some modifications.

We are looking forward to the warmer weather and the start of our decking project. For those who may have forgotten this year's Subscriptions, I urge you to renew soon to help with our administrative costs.
